Some modal verbs do not change in the reported speech.

Jane: "The doctor might propose an operation."	Jane said the doctor might propose an operation.
you to the operating room."	Jane said (that) the doctor would take me to the operating room if he had been there.
Jane: "You used to go to a doctor."	Jane said I used to go to a doctor.



Some modal verbs change in reported speech.
