## Present Perfect Continuous Tense

Why present perfect continuous tense ?

We use the present perfect continuous tense to talk about actions that started in the past and have continued up to now.

How do we form the present perfect continuous tense ?

I	Pos	I have been working in the garden for two hours.
You	Neg	I haven't been working in the garden for two hours.
We	Que	Have you been working in the garden for two hours?
They		
He	Pos	He has been working in the garden for two hours.
She	Neg	He hasn't been working in the garden for two hours.
It	Que	Has he been working in the garden for two hours?

### Important Notes

- We can also use **the present perfect continuous** to talk about actions that have been completed, but we can see their results in the present.
  - Sarah: *Oh, you've got sunburnt!*
  - Tom: *I've been sunbathing all afternoon.*
