

## Why do we use Present Simple Tense?

We use Present Simple to talk about regular activities, habits, opinions and give scientific facts or truths. There is also a future use of Present Simple tense when talking about timetables.

#### **Routines or Habits**

I brush my teeth in the mornings.

His flat mates work from 9 to 5 every weekday.

My uncle buys his clothes in that shop.

Mary and Tim always wear a suit on their wedding anniversaries.

She has her lunch in that small café.



## **Opinions**

She doesn't like horror and action films.

My brother **thinks** playing chess is boring.

We agree with your new idea.

## **Scientific Facts or Truths**

The earth revolves around the Sun.

Paris is in France.

## **Timetables**

The first lesson starts at quarter past ten.

The plane to Rome departs at ten.

Next Saturday is my birthday.



## How do we form present simple tense?

For all subject pronouns we use the base form of the verb. For third singular pronouns we add '-s' to the ending of the verb.

I / you / we / they VERB (base form)

- I play football.
- You play football.
- We play football.
- They play football.

He/She/It VERB [-5]

- He plays football.
- She plays football.
- It plays with a ball.



## What about negative and question forms?

In questions and negative sentences we use "do" or "does". We use "do" along with I,you, we they. We use "does" along with he, she, it.

#### **Positive Sentence**


- I drink milk before bedtime.
- Tom drinks milk before bedtime.

## **Negative Sentences**

- I don't drink milk before bedtime.
- Tom doesn't drink milk before bedtime.

#### Questions

- Do you drink milk before bedtime?
- Does Tom drink milk before bedtime?



## What about to be verb?

To be verb is used to talk about *states* not actions. We can make any descriptions in which there is no action. Remember how you say your name, your age, your feelings, the colour of the sky etc.


For example...

His name is John. (His name)

My brothers are 15 years old. (His age)

This city ten't perfect for you. (A description)

I am tired now. (feeling, mood)




## What are the to be verb forms?

There are three forms of "to be" in Present Simple.

I am from the USA. I'm not from Scotland.

You/we/They > You 're/are 13 years old. You're not a baby.

He/She/It > She 's/is a naughty girl. She 's/is not hardworking at all.
